Mid-Year Service and CE Reminder

As June and the busy summer season arrive, it's hard to believe that we are halfway through 2023. Whether you are an Intern, a Certified Master Gardener or an Emeritus Master Gardener, it's time to take stock of your Service and Continuing Education (CE) hours for the year and make a plan to complete them in time for recertification. Below are a few reminders.

June through the end of August is the busiest time in the Extension Master Gardener calendar. Clinic and demonstration garden activity drops dramatically

after August, and it becomes difficult to find hours. We suggest you plan to complete most of your hours by early September.

Our certification and recertification process is built with this in mind. The deadline for completing your recertification hours is November 30. When you are planning for hours, keep in mind that the deadline is the end of November, not the end of the year.

You can find Continuing Education opportunities in every issue of the Master Gardener Connection, and service opportunities in The Garden of Opportunities email sent mid-month. If you are concerned about your ability to complete your hours, please let the Program Office (king.mg@wsu.edu) know as soon as you can. We can help you plan for getting the hours or discuss options such as leave of absence.

Fire-Resistant Landscaping Workshops

In support of one of our nine Master Gardener Program Priorities, BDG Workshops will be offering two new workshops on the subject of Fire-Resistant Landscape

Gardening. These workshops will cover how to use fire-resistant and drought-tolerant plants, materials, design and landscape maintenance to prevent the spread of fire to your home.

Recent summers have been drier and warmer and present new challenges. People in Western Washington have not traditionally been concerned with grass and debris fires spreading through their neighborhoods. But, according to a 2022 King County report, wildfire danger in King County is increasing due to climate change and human actions resulting in 350,000 King County residents at risk.

On July 22, BDG Workshops is presenting the workshop, **Introduction to Fire Resistant Landscaping**. This class is an introduction to practical steps property owners can take to reduce fire risks. It is being offered free as a public service to the greater community.

City of Shoreline Sponsors a New Summer Gardening Series

We are pleased to announce a new partnership to help residents of Shoreline learn gardening techniques that will

keep our waterways clean. The City of Shoreline is sponsoring a summer

gardening series by the King County Master Gardeners (KCMG). This series of classes will emphasize techniques to prevent or reduce the use of pesticides, herbicides, and other hazardous materials.

These introductory or refresher courses will be offered free for Shoreline residents, and are intended for individuals interested in learning current, science-based approaches to different topics in gardening. The series is being sponsored with a \$6,000 grant from the City of Shoreline and is not approved Continuing Education for Extension Master Gardeners. Congratulations to the Development team of Extension Master Gardeners Joan Baldwin, Linda Peterson and Joe Jennings for securing the grant and handling all the details for a great series. The eight in-person classes will run from May 20 to August 19 in Shoreline.

New Collaboration with Maple Valley Food Bank & South King County Food Coalition

King County Master Gardeners are teaming up with the South King County Food Coalition and Maple Valley Food Bank (MVFB) to offer six vegetable gardening classes to address food insecurity in the area. The MVFB will serve as the hub with free local classes, resources for garden space, information about workshops which offer low-income waivers, and adaptive techniques. KCMG will provide the class content and teachers. This collaboration will leverage MVFB's relationships and facility in the south King County area and utilize KCMG's educational expertise to provide science-based, sustainable vegetable gardening classes. The classes will run June 8 through October 1 at the Maple Valley Food Bank, 21415 Renton-Maple Valley Rd, Maple Valley.
