Diagnostic Workshop Recap

On June 23, the Diagnostic Lab and the Education Leadership Team offered two in-person Diagnostic Workshops at the Bellevue Botanical Garden. The morning and afternoon sessions, presented by Extension Coordinator/Educator Jenny Glass, were well attended and thoughtfully prepared, with three large tables full of specimen plants with health issues caused by fungus, insects and cultural damage.



Some of the key takeaways were:

Ask questions! When confronted with a plant problem, ask:

- What did you see damaged?
- When did you notice the damage and what is its impact?
- What changes have happened in the plant's surroundings?

Asking these questions helps to gather information in a way that is nonthreatening and that focuses on problem solving.

Mushroom Classes are not CE Approved

Mushrooms are fascinating and many gardeners also have a deep interest in them. However, giving advice on them is outside of our scope as WSU Extension Master Gardeners.

The Master Gardener Program Handbook (rev. 2020) states: "Mushrooms and Foraging: It is our strict policy never to identify mushrooms...for edibility and safety. Instead, we note the ways that mushrooms either cause problems for or assist gardeners. Clients may be referred to their local mycological society for mushroom questions, and they may be advised that something is potentially poisonous or dangerous, but a client should never be advised that something is 'safe.' If in doubt, consult staff." For


