The Bellevue Demonstration Garden Spring Plant Sale is coming back this year! It's been four years since Bellevue Demonstration Garden (BDG) held an inperson plant sale and we're excited to host



this event at the garden once again. This year's spring sale will feature warm-season veggie starts as well as ornamentals. Offerings will include basil, peppers, eggplant, summer and winter squashes, cucumbers, tomatillos and, of course, tomatoes. There will be more than 30 varieties of tomatoes, including rare, unusual and hard-to-find types, as well as perennial favorites. All of the veggie starts are grown by Master Gardeners at the City of Bellevue greenhouse located just a few blocks from BDG.

Master Gardeners can pre-order plants for pick-up on Wednesday, May 10, 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. The sale will be open to the public on Saturday, May 13, from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. Bellevue Demo Garden is located at 15500 SE 16th Street in Bellevue. Nearby parking is available both on the street and in the parking lot.

Foodies in the Garden

'Marshall' Strawberry

A "new" small fruit offering by mail order and local nurseries is the 'Marshall' strawberry,

Fragaria ananassa 'Marshall'. Once thought extinct, the berry plant was rediscovered in 2004 and is now gaining popularity. We planted Marshall Strawberries late last summer in the perennial bed and they are adapting well. The berry plants were the latest plant exchange from our collaboration with gardeners at Ellensburg's Olmstead Pioneer Farm.

Considered the best-flavored American strawberry at the time, the 'Marshall' was extensively planted in the Pacific Northwest. Strawberries were the leading crop in Washington State in the early 20th century until the 1950s and 60s. Many believe the near demise of the plant in the 1940s was from perishability (poor candidate for shipping) and imported disease (strawberry wrinkle virus). However, further research links the war time internment of Japanese Americans as a major contributing factor to the 'Marshall' strawberry's fall from popularity. There were 55 Japanese American families that grew strawberries in the Bellevue area alone and many more on Vashon and Bainbridge Islands and the surrounding Puget Sound area. Japanese Americans farmed the Eastside lakeshore from Yarrow Bay, Hunt's Point, Medina, Newport and Mercer Slough to Sammamish.

Finn Hill Demo Garden: Spring Youth Outreach

Master Gardener volunteers from the Finn Hill demo garden have been in high gear this spring offering Youth Outreach programs to 28 preschool children at the St. John Vianney Church on Tuesday,



April 18, and also to a smaller group of middle school students at the Environmental and Adventure School on April 19.

The preschoolers were split into three groups and rotated through three learning stations. Master Gardener Sharon O'Grady led a garden tour and showed them a variety of overwintered produce (kale, Swiss chard, mustard greens, carrots, garlic chives, onions and shallots) with nearly all of them eager to snack on the greens! The two other sessions were held inside the classroom with Master Gardener Alex Cowan showing them the plant life cycle process using dry seeds, germinated seeds and small seedlings sporting a tiny stem and "seed leaves." Each child got to plant a sunflower seed in a peat pot and label it with their name. Meanwhile, Master Gardener Susan Busch captivated the third group of students at the worm bin station teaching them the value of composting with worms, what worms eat, what they need for bedding and best of all being able to touch them! A great day was had by all!
