## Growing Groceries Corner: Adding Asparagus to Your Garden

Have you ever considered growing a vegetable that rewards with a delicious early spring harvest for years, has elegant feathery foliage growing up to six feet tall in summer and fall, and attracts pollinators? Asparagus could be your next consideration.

Asparagus (Asparagus officinalis) is a hardy perennial vegetable. A member of the lily family, the fern-like foliage turns from green to gold in the fall. Known for its tender spears and rich flavor, it is a rewarding crop for home gardeners.

## Bellevue Demonstration Garden Annual Spring Plant Sale



**Celebrate Native Plant Appreciation Month with Washington Native Plant Society Sale & Events** 


