# Reminder: Help Washington #BeatTheBeetle!

The Washington State
Department of Agriculture is
actively working to eradicate the
Japanese beetle (*Popilla*japónica) from Washington.

Beetles are showing up in South King County, so don't forget to keep an eye out in your garden and report any suspected sightings! The WSDA has also created an interactive map where you can track beetle catches across the state.

### New Plants, Including Ivy, Added to WSDA Noxious List

In July, the Washington State
Department of Agriculture
added 19 species, including
English ivy, to its noxious weed,
seed, and plant quarantine list.

The WSDA said public support for including English ivy was especially strong. Ivy can shade out tree foliage, cause bark damage and add weight to trees, increasing the risk of wind damage. It can also crowd out native plants.


# **Learn All About Hops at the Annual Kent Hops Festival**
