A Note from the Program Coordinator

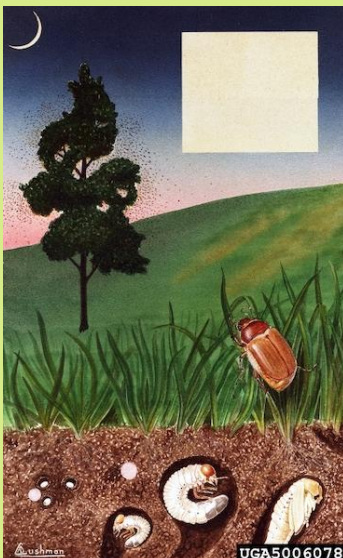

"The Extension Master Gardener 50th anniversary campaign will kick off on Monday, March 20, 2023, which is the official first day of spring.

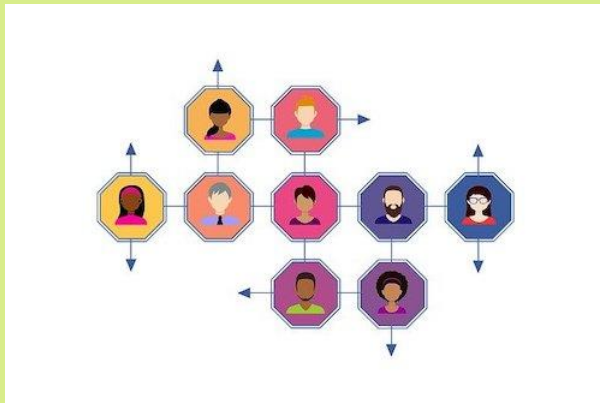

Founded in 1973 by Washington State University (WSU) Extension agents in King and Pierce counties, the Extension Master Gardener concept has been replicated throughout the United States and internationally. Today there are 85,000 certified Extension Master Gardeners worldwide."

Inevitably, I’ll receive questions at an Ask-a-Master-Gardener clinic or after a public lecture about the appropriate time to plant these little bundles of future color and heralds of the next long-awaited springtime. The short answer to this often-asked question is “Plant ‘em if you got ‘em – the sooner, the better, *but* later is okay too.” This column may be about “bulbs,” but, included in the term, are more than just true bulbs, such as tulips. This advice includes plants with tuberous roots, tubers, corms and rhizomes. This information can be applied to all of them.

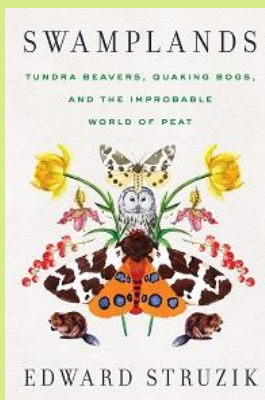
